Providing public safety to our citizens and its visitors is paramount. The Thurmont Police Department and Town Officials will continue in a collaborative manner to ensure that our community is safe and secure. In doing so, the following adjustments have to be made:

The Town of Thurmont is prohibiting vehicles to stop, stand or park at any time on North Church Street and East Moser Road. The width of the roadways have been narrowed, causing a safety issue when vehicles are parked along the street. Vehicles to include Emergency apparatuses will not be able to pass freely and safely. State law prohibits vehicles from blocking any portion of a roadway and prohibits obstructing or hindering the free passage of another.

The Thurmont Police Department has been directed to strictly enforce these restrictions.

We apologize for any inconvenience and ask that you assist us in keeping our community safe.

The following NO PARKING areas will be strictly enforced on Friday,
Saturday and Sunday:

- E. Moser Road
- N. Church St.
- N. Carroll St.
- Apples Church Rd.- East side from Carroll Street to Eyer Road.
- All Ramps leading onto and exiting Rt. 15

The following streets will be closed from 8:00am to 6:00pm on Saturday
and Sunday:

- Frederick Rd. (from Moser Rd. to Water St.)
Water St. (from Summit Ave. to Main St.)
- S. Center Street
- Park Lane
- Municipal Alley
- Polley's Alley
- Howard Street
(Laundromat to Frederick Road)

All Yard Sale Signs must be attached to their own stake or post. They
cannot be attached to any existing utility pole, sign post, building, or
other structure.

Motorized Go-Karts, Golf Carts, All-Terrain Vehicles

During Colorfest Weekend only, the use of All-Terrain Vehicles and Golf- Carts may be used by the following, in the performance of their official duties:

1. Government agencies, to include Town Officials and employees,
2. EMS/Fire Rescue personnel,
3. Service Vehicles, i.e. Sanitation employees, Security Contractors
4. Mobile devices for disabled persons, which include electronic-motor-driven wheelchairs and scooters.

Authorization for use will be limited within the areas of the event and on Closed Streets. Use at other locations are prohibited and subject to the penalties in accordance with the State of Maryland Transportation Article.

“All-Terrain vehicle” shall be defined as a motor-driven, off road, recreational vehicle capable of cross-country travel on land, snow, ice, marsh, swampland or other natural terrain. It includes, but not limited to, multitrack, multiwheel or low-pressure tire vehicles (ATVs), off-road motorcycles (dirt bikes), or belt-driven vehicles (snowmobiles).
